HOLY COMMUNION DURING THE FLU SEASON

Due to the severity of the flu season, we have been directed that the Precious Blood not be distributed in any form at Mass beginning this weekend, and continuing throughout the winter months or until the flu season ends.

During this time, we are also asked to avoid bodily contact during the Sign of Peace. A simple bow of the head will be sufficient.

John the Baptist's words are with us again today as we hear him say "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world!"

Sound familiar?

Well, we hear these words proclaimed again each Sunday (indeed, at every Mass) when we are invited to receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

Jesus, before he was led like a lamb to slaughter, shared his Body and Blood with his closet friends and asked that they continue to do this in his memory.

We are indeed blessed to be called weekly to this Eucharistic holy meal of the Lord Jesus.

THE WORD SPEAKS AGAIN TO US...

Isaiah, Paul, and John the Baptist were each called by God for a special purpose.

Isaiah tells us of being called to reach out first to the exiled people of Israel and then to all nations.

Paul tells the Corinthians that he was called to be an apostle.

John the Baptist was called to make Jesus known by baptizing with water.

Now it is our turn to listen for God's call. Then we can respond, as we do in today's psalm, "Here I am Lord; I come to do your will."

Question of the Week:

Am I willing to serve those who are not of "my own tribe," as did Isaiah, Paul, John the Baptist, and Jesus?

**WEEK OF PRAYER FOR
CHRISTIAN UNITY**

The annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is being observed this year from January 18th to 25th.

This year's theme, "They Showed Us Unusual Kindness" finds its origins in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 27:18 – 28:10) and emphasizes that it is through this "unusual kindness" that Christians are united as one.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity began as an eight day period of prayer called the Church Unity Octave at Graymoor, and was established by founders of the Society of the Atonement, Mother Lurana White, SA, and Servant of God Father Paul of Graymoor.

Peter & Paul. 10 years ago, on Candlemas Day, we began with 27 people attending the first Mass in Spanish, and today we have over 300 who regularly attend this Mass and are registered members of our bilingual parish family. Bishop Ricken will celebrate the Mass and preach the homily. All parishioners are invited to this very colorful and jubilant celebration. A Mexican style dinner will be served in the school cafeteria following the Mass.

Blessing of Throats: On Monday, February 3rd, we celebrate the Feast of St. Blase. Holy Mass WILL BE offered at 8:00am, with the Blessing of Throats given after Mass.
