The “Sign of Peace” at Holy Mass

The *Kiss of Peace* is an ancient Christian greeting. The term now used is "the sign of peace" or "the rite of peace." The priest says or sings: *"The peace of the Lord be with you always,"* to which the people respond: *"And with your spirit."* Then, as stated in the Roman Missal, **"if appropriate, the Deacon, or the Priest, adds: 'Let us offer each other the sign of peace.'"**

The Sign of Peace is COMPLETED with the verbal exchange between the Priest and People. Nothing is lost if the optional "exchange among the people" is not called for by the celebrant. To Learn More Online, [Click Here](#).

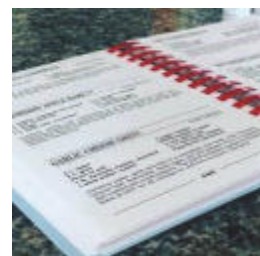
HOLY COMMUNION DURING THE FLU SEASON

Dear Family in Christ,

TODAY WE CELEBRATE THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD...CANDLEMAS DAY!

Forty days after Jesus was born, in accordance with the Torah, Mary and Joseph brought Him to the temple in Jerusalem and presented Him to the Lord. What they could not have known in advance was that two people in the temple, Simeon and Anna, would recognize in the six-weeks old child, the Savior of the World.

As we celebrate this special feast today, let us challenge ourselves to recognize Jesus in the faces of those we meet.

THE WORD LIGHTS OUR WAY IN THE WORLD

The words from the first reading, "suddenly there will come to the temple the Lord whom you seek," could be placed right in the middle of the Gospel, as Simeon and Anna recognize in the infant Jesus "Christ the Lord" whom they had sought for so long.

St. Paul, in the Letter to the Hebrews, explains that Jesus had to become like us to bring salvation.

Listening to today's readings, let us pray that we are able to recognize the One whom we seek in our world today.

And, Friends, Let us Recommit to bringing the Light of Christ into our families during this new year of 2020.
