

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Risen Lord Jesus Christ ~ ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA!

Today begins the Easter season "The Lord is truly Risen, Alleluia," proclaims the entrance antiphon of the Mass.

All three readings speak to this foundational confession.

The Acts of the apostles begins our Easter journey. By Pentecost Sunday, come June, we will have read the entire Book of Acts; the foundational structure of our Catholic-Christian Community we call the Universal Church of Jesus Christ.

So, please use each Sunday to grow in a better understanding of who we are as a Catholic Community.

The Gospel for today is taken from John. Mary, on discovering the tomb to be empty, tells this news to "Simon Peter and the other disciple whom Jesus loved."

The two ran to the tomb. The Beloved Disciple arrives first but, out of deference, allows Peter to enter the tomb first, before him. When the disciple saw the tomb empty, he saw and believed. For until this time, the disciples failed to understand Jesus' teaching that "He had to rise from the dead."

John, the beloved disciple, was the first to see and believe.

Only through devoted love does one come to grasp the mystery of Jesus' Resurrection and God's healing love for us.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK:

How do your daily actions witness to the Lord's Resurrection?

We are challenged today, and throughout this Easter Season, to cultivate hope and trust in the Divine Mercy and God's grace - despite the darkness and stressful times we are living through.

El Evangelio de hoy está tomado de Juan. María, al descubrir que la tumba está vacía, le cuenta esta noticia a "Simón Pedro y el otro discípulo a quien Jesús amaba". Los dos corrieron hacia la tumba. El discípulo amado llega primero pero, por deferencia, le permite a Pedro entrar primero en la tumba, antes que él. Cuando el discípulo vio la tumba vacía, vio y creyó. John, el discípulo amado, fue el primero en ver y creer.

Solo a través del amor devoto se llega a comprender el misterio de la resurrección de Jesús y el amor sanador de Dios por nosotros.

PREGUNTA DE LA SEMANA:

¿Cómo testifican sus acciones diarias de la resurrección del Señor?

Hoy tenemos el desafío, y a lo largo de esta temporada de Pascua, de cultivar la esperanza y la confianza en la Divina Misericordia y la gracia de Dios, a pesar de la oscuridad y los tiempos estresantes que estamos viviendo. 
