

Dear Fellow Devotees of the Eucharistic Adoration Chapel
at Ss. Peter & Paul Parish in Green Bay,

We have received permission from Bishop Ricken to re-open the adoration chapel!

Our plan is to re-open on Sunday, June 14th – The Solemnity of Corpus Christi – following our 10am Bilingual Mass. At the conclusion of Mass, we will have an outdoor – physically distanced & safe – Eucharistic Procession, at the end of which we will return the Blessed Sacrament to the Adoration Chapel. The chapel will remain open that day until 9:00pm, and will then be closed for the overnight hours, until 9:00am Monday.

As we slowly phase in the re-opening of the chapel, we will initially only be open for adorers from 9:00am to 9:00pm.

Due to personal distance requirements, there can only be 4 people in the adoration chapel at any one time.

In terms of scheduled hours, we are “starting from scratch.” The previous schedule no longer applies. We will schedule 2 adorers per hour, and leave the other 2 spots for visitor-adorers.

When you ask for a reserved hour, please have at least TWO possible hours in mind, in case the hour you prefer has already been chosen by two other people. To reserve your hour, please contact the Parish Office 920.435.7548 and speak with Margo Thorsen, Maria Tinoco, or Michael Lee (920.437.0651).

Presently, the Coordinator Team for the Chapel is Tyler Reif and Maria Tinoco. Their phone numbers will be posted in the adoration chapel. No other person is to take on any responsibilities (cleaning, decorating, etc) with regard to the chapel.

Some Policy Changes:

We no longer accept any donations of books, pamphlets, cards, etc. All books and devotional materials, and rosaries, will be provided by the parish. Any other materials, as we find them, will be disposed of.

We no longer accept artificial flowers or plants. Only fresh flowers and plants will be allowed, and they will be cared for by a member of our parish staff.

The statues and pictures currently in the chapel are the only ones that are to be there.

No candles or vigil lights are to be brought into the chapel. Only the electric ones we have there now are to be used.

Do not post anything (fliers, signs, etc) in the adoration chapel. Everything must go through the parish office for approval. All postings will be done by parish staff members.

Our security system has been enhanced both inside and outside of the chapel, with the goal being your protection.

A New Door Code is now in effect. Please contact the parish office, in person, for the code. Please do not give the code to anyone else; refer them to the office. Otherwise, we will have to change it again – sooner than planned (annually).

If you experience anyone hanging around inside or outside the chapel – who gives you reason to be afraid or concerned, please call the police – rather than the rectory or the office.

FINALLY: Although the “ideal” is that every hour will be filled and every adorer will always arrive on time, we all know that it will not always work out that way. The cabinet holding the Blessed Sacrament has doors on it that can be closed when no one will be in the chapel. This has the same effect as when the doors of the tabernacle are closed. Thus, when you need to leave, and no one else will be there, please close the doors over the Blessed Sacrament before you leave. If you arrive and find no one there, please open the doors over the Blessed Sacrament for your adoration time.
