Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday is the Solemnity of All Saints. Some are saints that are well known and loved by many people, but the majority of the saints are simple, humble, and unknown by the world.

This wonderful solemnity celebrates the victory of all those saints who have made it into heaven — all who knew God, loved Him with their whole being, and gave themselves in charity to God and to those around them. These are the saints who are in Heaven; worshiping God and interceding for us, that one day all of us may be together before the throne of God and the Lamb. “...*I had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people and tongue...they stood before the throne and before the Lamb...*” (Rev. 7:2 -14).

This great multitude of saints are those who were washed in the Blood of the Lamb (Rev. 7:14). In their humility they let themselves be loved and transformed by the mercy of the Father. When these saints let themselves be loved by God the Father, our Lord revealed to them their own vocations in life.

Our Lord draws us to Himself so that we may be loved, and then sends us out on a mission to spread the fragrance of His mercy with all whom we encounter. We are all called to do this in our own way of living.

Within the multitude of saints we have priests, religious, married couples, young people, single people, and of course children whom the Lord has called at an early age. All these saints had in common that their hearts were burning with love for God, but they lived it in different ways. Some God called to the priesthood, religious life, marriage, or consecrated life. Regardless of their vocations, they experienced the ardent mercy of God and they couldn't help but spread it around the world!

This Sunday is the beginning of Vocation Awareness Week. Today and the rest of the week we are invited to pray more intensively for vocations to the Church in the priesthood and religious life. For those of us who found our vocations in life, we are called to reflect in prayer

on how we are doing. In the intimacy of prayer, Our Lord wants to give us a foretaste of the beauty of heaven, so that our hearts may burn with the desire to live with Him there forever.

May we pray for our own vocations and for an abundance of holy vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life from our Parish of Saints. Peter and Paul. *Lord, help us set our hearts on heaven, so that we may live everyday according to your will. Amen.*

Estimada Familia Parroquial,

Este domingo es la Solemnidad de Todos los Santos. Algunos son santos muy conocidos y amados por muchas personas. Pero la mayoría de los santos son sencillos, humildes y desconocidos por el mundo.

Esta maravillosa solemnidad celebra la victoria de todos los santos que han llegado al cielo. Todos conocieron a Dios, lo amaban con todo su ser y se entregaron en caridad a Dios y a los que les rodeaban. Estos son los santos que están en el cielo, adorando a Dios e intercediendo por nosotros para que un día todos estemos juntos ante el trono de Dios y del Cordero. "... *Vi luego una muchedumbre tan grande, que nadie podía contarla... eran individuos de todas las naciones y razas, de todos los pueblos y lenguas ...*" (Rev 7: 2-14). Esta gran multitud de santos fueron lavados en la Sangre del Cordero (Rev 7:14). En su humildad se dejaron amar y transformar por la misericordia del Padre.

Cuando estos santos se dejaron amar por Dios Padre, nuestro Señor les reveló su propia vocación en la vida.
